The Impachment Movement. The resolution impeaching Governor Scott of high crimes and misdemeanors was defeated in the House of Representatives yesterday, and in a party sense, the result is all that we could have desired. In the face of this evidence, the representatives of the Radical party have chosen to decline to put the culprit on trial. They have shown their unwillingness to purify South Carolina Republicanism. They have deliberately determined to shield from punishment a self-convicted knave. It remains now for the minority in the Legislature, and for the taxpayers of the State, to take up the work of reform, and give to the people the honest and able government which they both desire and demand. This can be accomplished by co-operation of action on the part of all citizens of South Carolina who are not thieves or fools.
