The Conspirators Unmasked.

The leader in the attack upon Charleston is Mr. William B. Johnston, of Macon, who affects, we believe, to have no desire to injure this people in any manner. This gentleman was present at the meeting of stockholders of the South Carolina Railroad Company, held yesterday, in this city. At a nod from him, Mr. Cabbage, of Macon, offered a resolution requiring the Board of Directors to call a special meeting of the stockholders to consider any proposition that might be made to lease the road upon the basis of a guaranteed dividend of five per cent. or more.

What, we may ask, were the admissions made by Mr. John H. James? Far from denying that the Central Railroad of Georgia desired to lease the South Carolina Railroad, he took as the foundation of his argument the fact that a lease of the road, with a dividend guaranteed by the Central Railroad, would cause the price of the stock to advance, and put two and a half million dollars in the pockets of the stockholders.
