We do not undertake to decide whether the General Assembly has, or has not, the authority to confer upon a corporation the power to tear up the streets and lay tracks without regard to municipal regulations; but we do believe that the public interest is best served by remitting these matters, under proper restrictions, to the decision of the people of the city or town in which the work is to be done.

New York is full of trouble. There were twenty new cases of small-pox in that city—a large increase—on Saturday, and seven deaths; the spotted fever is on the increase; the croton water is impure, leading to fears of a visit from the cholera; and the street contractor, one Brown, allows "disgusting heaps of filth" to accumulate in the thoroughfares and spread their foul odors broadcast.

A New York correspondent, writing on the 11th instant, says: "Rumors come thick and fast from Washington to prominent politicians here that a new Republican combination is on foot whereby, in order to preserve the unity of the party, General Grant and Mr. Greeley both are to be dropped at Philadelphia and some new man taken up. The overtures to that end are sufficiently definite to excite considerable apprehension on the part of the Democratic managers, and there is much telegraphing in consequence between the Manhattan Club, Fifth avenue, and the New York delegation in Congress. What it all amounts to we shall probably see in a day or two."

At Boston recently the vane on the steeple of the East Cambridge Methodist Church, requiring repairs, a man named Dooris volunteered to ascend and throw it down. He climbed up by means of a small ladder, and having accomplished his object, proceeded to descend. After coming down part of the way he found himself on a tower twenty-five feet above the roof of the church, his ladder immovably fixed, and himself quite unable to move either upwards or downwards.

Mr. Greeley has acted wisely in retiring absolutely from the editorship of the New York Tribune during the Presidential canvass. As long as Mr. Greeley retained his position it was not practicable for the great newspaper which he founded, to do its full work in the campaign; and his opponents were free in expressing their joy that the guns of the Tribune were silenced by its editor's nomination at Cincinnati.
