THE GROWING CROPS.

Reports from South Carolina. We have received from our attentive correspondents the following interesting information relative to the growing crops: Cotton.

Our correspondent, L. G. C., writing from Ninety-six, under date of May 20, makes the following report: 1. Area of cotton planted one-third less than last year.

Our correspondent, C. W., writing from Laurensville, under date of May 19th, says: 1. The area in cotton is about the same as last season.

Our correspondent, Quddouf, writing under date of May 18, says: 1. The area in cotton is one-fourth greater than in 1871.

Our correspondent E. McC. C., writing from Gadsden under date of May 20, says: 1. Area in cotton one-third more than in 1871.

Our correspondent T. C. W., writing from Bennettsville on the 20th, says: 1. The area in cotton this year is eight or ten per cent. more than in 1871.

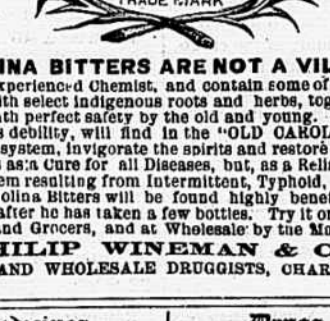
