COMMERCIAL NEWS.

The Charleston Market. FOR THE WEEK ENDING THURSDAY, JAN. 10, 1873. THE CROPS.—This period was generally clear and moderate, afterwards closing with rain, and without developments of importance.

NAVY.—There were limited arrivals under this head, say about 500 bushels turpentine and 2000 bushels rosin.

GRAIN.—The receipts were moderate, and we note sales (very) in the week of 100 bushels turpentine at 54c per gallon, 600 bushels strained to extra No. 1 rosin at \$3 50 per bushel...

HAIR.—There were received about 600 bales of Havana and 600 bales North River kinds; sales of North River descriptions were made at \$1 75 per hundred, and of Eastern at \$1 80 per hundred.

CORN.—The receipts were light, about 1500 bushels from Baltimore came to hand. The market has been quiet with mostly a retail business.

WHEAT.—There are some limited arrivals, and we quote fair to choice qualities at \$1 30 to \$1 50 per bushel.

FLOUR.—There are fair supplies of most qualities of this article, with a moderate demand prevailing; fine qualities being firmer, while common grades are easy.

RAILROADS.—The stocks are generally fair. We note a moderate business in fair to fully fair Louisiana sugar at 9c per lb. Good to prime good Cuban 10c to 11c.
