A CARD FROM REPRESENTATIVE HAMILTON.

COLUMBIA, S. C., February 12.

To the Editor of the Daily Union:

To the Editor of the Daily Union:
SIR—The action of the House of Representatives on yesterday, by which I was suspended from the privileges of a member for the balance of the session, was, in my opinion, so hasty and unjust, that I am required in self-defence to make a public explanation of the whole affair. I had given notice in writing, as it was my right to do under the rules, that on third reading of a bill to make appropriation to pay claims arising under the proclamation of third reading of a bill to make approximate pay claims arising under the preclamation of the Governor of the State, dated July 23, 1871, I would offer certain amendments. When the bill came up yesterday for a third reading it was dispatched so quickly that I was not aware of it, and as the House was proceeding to the next bill on the calendar, I called the attention of the Speaker to the fact that I proposed to amend the bill by moving that \$35,000 be stricken out and \$18,600 be inserted, that being the amount of the rewards for 93 convictions at \$200 each—the amount of reward of fered in the proclamation referred to. I was willing to pay the first claims in this case against the State, but was not willing that the State bould be defrauded out of \$16,400. My motion to reconsider the vote was ruled out of claims arising under the preclamation of motion to reconsider the vote was ruled out of order by the Speaker, who claimed that the bill had been sent to the Senate, and was beyond the centrol of the Heuse. At this point I rose to a privileged question, as I held that my rights had been invaded and charged that the bill had not gone to the Senate, and that the Speaker had passed the bill himself; that a dozen members were not aware that the bill was before the House, and that his action and ruling proved that he was interested in the bill. I was ruled out of order; and because I persisted in speaking to my questic. Of privilege,

I was ruled out of order; and because I persisted in speaking to my questic. of privilege, the House took action by which i as suspended. I stand ready to prove that the bill was still on the Speaker's deak when I made the motion to reconsider. All I asked was, that justice be done to the State, and that my rights as a member be respected. On last Saturday. I went to the Speaker, and asked him why he would not recognize me on this measure. He said it was because I opposed the measure, and he would recognize only such members as favored it, as he wanted it to pass.

I had the same trouble with him on the passare of the furniture claim, on which I held that the State was being swindled out of \$58,000. I leave the whole matter for the public to judge who was right and who was wrong.

I do not regret my action, and rather than
