7th. Equal rights and protection for naturalized and native-born citizens, at home and abroad; the assertion of American nationality which shall command the respect of foreign powers...

8th. In demanding these measures and reforms, we arraign the radical party for its disregard of right, and its unparalleled oppression and tyranny...

It has nullified the right of trial by jury; it has abolished the habeas corpus, that most sacred writ of liberty; it has overthrown the freedom of speech and the press...

It has entered the post and telegraph offices; it has seized the private papers and letters, without any specific charge or notice of affidavit...

It has converted the American Capitol into a bastle; it has established a system of spies and official espionage to which no constitutional monarchy of Europe would now dare resort...

It has destroyed its original jurisdiction, which is irrevocably vested by the Constitution, in the learned Chief Justice...

It has subjected to the most atrocious calumnies, merely because he would not prostitute his high office to the support of the false and partizan charges preferred against the President...

Under its repeated assaults, the pillars of the Government are rocking on their base, and should it succeed in November next, and inaugurate a President, we will meet, as a subject and conquered people, amid the ruins of liberty and the scattered fragments of the Constitution...

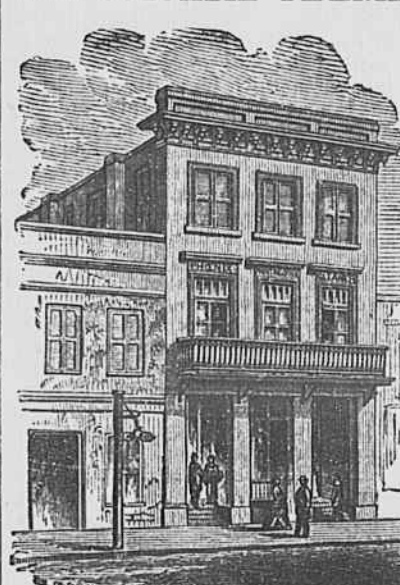
