Thanksgiving—A Proclamation.
BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

In the year which is now drawing to its end, the art, the skill and the labor of the people of the United States have been employed with greater diligence and vigor and on broader fields than ever before, and the fruits of the earth have been gathered into the granary and the store-house in marvelous abundance. Our highways have been lengthened, and new and prolific regions have been occupied. We are permitted to hope that long-protracted political and sectional dissensions are, at no distant day, to give place to returning harmony and fraternal affection throughout the republic. Many foreign States have entered into liberal agreements with us, while nations which are far off, and which heretofore have been unsocial and exclusive, have become our friends.

The annual period of rest, which we have reached in health and tranquility, and which is crowned with so many blessings, is by universal consent a convenient and suitable one for cultivating personal piety and practicing public devotion.

I, therefore, recommend that Thursday, the 26th day of November next, be set apart and observed by the people of the United States, as a day for public praise, thanksgiving and prayer to the Almighty Creator and Divine Ruler of the Universe, by whose ever watchful, merciful and gracious providence alone States and nations, no less than families and individual men, do live and move and have their being.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the city of Washington, the twelfth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and of the independence of the United States the ninety-third.

TERRIBLE ASSAULT AND MELANCHOLY CONSEQUENCES.—We learn that on Thursday last, Mr. Simpson Davis, of Union County, while returning to his home from Monroe, where he had been in attendance on Court, was beaten and assaulted by a negro, and beaten over the head in a most terrible manner. His skull was fractured, one eye knocked out, his jaw broken, and his face horribly lacerated. The instrument used was a heavy cane, with a long and heavy square iron ferrule. Strange to say, at our last accounts he was still alive.

But the consequences of this dreadful affair did not end with the treatment Mr. Davis received. He was a married man, and the father of ten children. His wife had been quite sick, but at the time of the assault, was convalescing. When told of it, the shock was so great to her, that she relapsed and died in two hours afterwards.

The negro, we learn, was arrested and lodged in Union jail.
