4n Act to provide for the Enumeration of the Inhabitants of the State.

Section 3. That it shall be the duty of each and every person appointed to take the census by wirtue of this factor each personally on the head or some member of each family in the County, or portion of County, for which he or they shall have been appointed, and obtain from such feed of a family or member thereof, at aforesaid, the number of persons contained in such family, and such other information as may be required and directed by the Commissioner of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics.

SEC. 4. That each head or member of a family shall, when summoned thereto by the persons appointed mider this Act to take the census at his, her or their residence or place of business, make, on oath or affirmation, a correct scium of all persons of whom his or her family is composed; and also report such other information to said census takers as may be required by law; and the persons of appointed to take the consus are hereby authorized to administer such oaths; and upon the failure of any person to make such returns or reports when required, he or she shall be subject to a penalty of twenty-five dollars, to be redovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.


