AN ÆRIAL RIDE ON A BYCICLE.—At Special Notices. the Mechanics' Pavillion yesterday, Paul Martinette accomplished one of the most perilous feats ever attempted at a public exhibition in this city, by riding a velocipede backward and forward on a single wire the whole length of that mammoth building. The wire was stretched from the front entrance of the pavillion to the old picture gallery at the back, a distance of 200 feet. In the centre of the fountain was placed an apright post to hold up the sag of the wire, so that the veloci-pede had to pass over a rather steep inclination to get over this post. Martinette, on the first velocipede ever used in the pavillion, run the machine at a smart pace to the top of the post, and remained there several seconds, when he started down the incline on the other side, and balanced the velocipede at the lowest level on the wire, and then came the whole distance back to the starting place without turning himself or the machine. When it is taken into consideration that the wire, less than half an inch thick, was suspended twenty feet from the floor, and a stumble would probably have been fatal, some idea of the peril of the feat may be formed. It was performed with as much ease as if the velocipede had been on the floor.
