THE following extract of "An Ordinance concerning streets, pavements, &c.," is published for information:

"That all owners of lots in the city of Columbia shall each repair, mend and keep, at his or her own expense, the sidewalk butting on his or her lot; and any person neglecting or refusing to do so after ten days' notice shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten (\$10) dollars for each and every day he or she shall or may so refuse or neglect; and it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police, after the expiration of said notice, to cause said sidewalk to be leveled and repaired at the expense of the owner, which expense, when approved by the Mayor and Aldermen, shall be collected in the same manner as the tax upon real estate."
