THE SWEEP OF THE STORM IN EUROPE. The Danish and Prussian Governments continue to receive official reports of the damages which have ensued at sea, along the coast and on land, in consequence of the terrible storm which visited the more Northern portions of Europe during the later days of the past week. The ac-counts are of very melancholy import. The amount of wreck and ruin which has been caused in the Danish territory is quite enormous, when viewed in a money value point of view. The losses sustained by the inhabitants of the island of Falstein, known as the Orchard of Denmark, already exceed the amount of a million of rix dollars. Prossia is still told of devastation in the Pomera-nian provinces. Schleswig and Holstein mourn at their firesides for lost friends and the prospect of commercial and agricultural bankruptcy; and it may be alleged with great truth that there is scarcely an industrial or financial inteready or may be affected. The King and Queen of Denmark are promitly active in their efforts for the relief and consolation of their stricken subjects. They are ably seconded by the members of the Oabinet in Copenhagen.
