THE WOMAN QUESTION.—The Missouri Republican says of woman suffrage: "The Republican party has half promised to grant the demand, and the Republican party, having control of Congress and of thirty State Legislatures, is able to make good its pledge. It is too late to say that the masses of that party are not prepared for the question—that, in fact, they are opposed to the sweeping revolution which it involves. The Philadelphia platform gave it a semi-endorsement, and in electing a Republican President and a Republican Congress on that platform they may be considered to have approved every word in that platform, including the endorsement of female suffrage."

Three national gold banks have been organized in California under the Act of July 12, 1870, with an aggregate capital of \$3,300,000, and circulation of \$1,480,000, based upon United States bonds, at the rate of eighty cents on the dollar. This currency is redeemable in coin, is more convenient than the coin itself in the transaction of business, and circulates freely at par upon the Pacific coast. Other applications have been made for the organization of similar institutions, and it is probable that this kind of circulation will be considerably increased during the coming year.

NUMEROUS POSTERITY.—A Mr. Feathers, of Sullivan County, Tenn., recently deceased at the age of ninety-six years, left a numerous posterity, viz: Sixteen children (nine sons and seven daughters), 123 grand-children, and 119 great-grand-children—in all, 268. His wife's maiden name was Barbara Sharratt. They were born and married in Sullivan County.
