CITY OF COLUMBIA
Secured by a Sinking Fund. Coupons secured by an Annual Tax and Redeemable for City Bonds by the City of Columbia. The City of Columbia has a bond of the City, limited by Law to \$2,000,000. Taxable Property of the City, \$7,000,000.

THE BONDS are authorized by an Act of Assembly approved March 13, 1872, for the construction of the new City Hall. Their final redemption is, by the terms of said Act, secured by a sinking fund to be accumulated from the annual rents of the building. These rents will result from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per annum. Coupons will be paid semi-annually on the 1st of January and 1st of July. The City of Columbia holds a lien on the building for a term of twenty years, as trustee, with power to collect the rents and hold the same invested as a fund for the redemption of the bonds.

By said Act a special assignment is required to be made to pay the annual coupons, and the City of Columbia National Bank is made the trustee of the city to receive the taxes when collected and to pay the coupons. This company also receives for city taxes.

The taxable property of the city is at present assessed at \$7,000,000; and by said Act the total debt of the city cannot be increased beyond \$600,000, while these bonds are outstanding. The bonds are exempt by law from city taxes.

These bonds are offered to the public at eighty not, with interest from date of purchase to January 1, 1872, allowed in settlement. After that date, the accrued interest to be added.
