 The others read and listen.

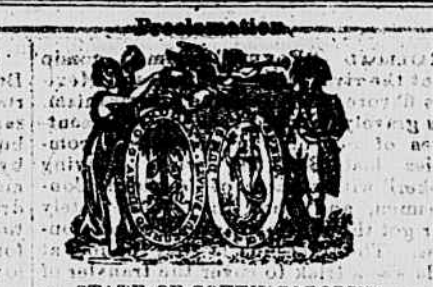
**A DIFFIDENT SWAIN.**—The New Orleans Times tells this story:
