And in case any person shall erect any house as aforesaid, without having the same located by the City Surveyor as aforesaid, such person shall be subject to a penalty of \$45 for each and every offence."

The conditions attached to the Ordinance will be strictly required, and the penalty of non-compliance to its terms be rigidly enforced and without the slightest delay.
