IMPORTANT RAILROAD DECISION. - The Supreme Court of the United States, in a case appealed from the Supreme Court of Wisconsin, involving the question whether a State has the right to levy taxes for the purpose of aiding in the construction of railroads, expressed the opinion that railroads are public highways, and that it is just as lawful for the State to impose taxes to aid in their construction as it is for the purpose of building a wagon road or any other publie work. In the judgment of the court, such tax is not prohibited by that clause of the Federal Constitution which provides that private property shall not be taken for public use without just com-pensation. If railroads are public high-ways, then they are under the legislative control of the State, and may be regulated as to their management and freight and passenger tariffs, in any manner and to any extent that may be demanded by the interests of the public.




