A REMINISCENCE OF THE WAR.—In his "Jail Journal," John Mitchell writes of *bellum* days, 1862, in Richmond. Speaking of the organization of the Confederate army, let us here mention a very surprising part of his history: "The officers being elective, and the time appointed for the new election falling last summer, just when the enemy, in overwhelming force, was pressing upon Yorktown on their way up the peninsula towards Richmond, the elections were held there and then, on the line, in the trenches, in actual presence of the enemy. Was there ever before an instance of an army changing, by election, the whole body of its regimental officers on the very eve of battle? Yet here it was done, quietly, regularly, without a moment's excitement or confusion. This, as well as several other examples I could mention, has brought me to the conclusion that of all races of men of the world, these Southerners have the largest amount of *sang froid*—of genuine impassive coolness and steadiness. Yet the very contrary is the current and received idea of their character. Southern impulsiveness, Southern passion, and wild, blind fury—this is the cant. The direct opposite is the fact."

BREAKING LOOSE FROM PARTY.—The Independence (Iowa) *Conservative* says the anti-monopoly movement in that State is a spontaneous uprising of the people, separate and outside of the grange organization. Speaking of its own (Buchanan) County, the *Conservative* says: 500 men have thrown down party lines, in a petition for the new organization, and 1,000 more in the County are with them in the move. They are leaving old parties for self-protection. Borne down by rings, monopolists, corruption and thievery, with taxes piled mountain high, they see no hope in the old organizations."

Tax Notice.
I HEREBY notify the tax-payers of Richland County that I shall be at my office from 9 o'clock A. M. to 2 o'clock P. M., from the 1st of July to August 20, 1873, to receive returns from each and all persons liable to tax on real estate and personal property for taxation of 1873; also, all taxable polls are required to make returns under the amended Act of the General Assembly, approved 20th February, 1873, to enforce the payment of the poll tax, and in default of the payment of this tax shall be subject to a penalty of double the amount of their poll tax and required to work upon the highway or roads. Any one who shall refuse to conform to the requirements of this Act or obey the directions of the County Commissioners, shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for the same in the County jail for a term not less than ten days.

The Act of the General Assembly provides for the re-assessment of real estate, and to correct the records of the County Auditor's office of errors, if any exist, and to furnish a correct and complete return of all taxable property in Richland County.
The law also requires the County Auditor to assess all parties who fail to make a return of their real and personal property within the time above noted, with a penalty of 50 per cent. on both.
The law in this particular will be rigidly enforced, except in cases of sickness or absence from the County, and all returns will be received and assessments made in accordance with law, at the Auditor's office, in Columbia, S.
