HEALTH HINTS.—Warm bread "packs" the stomach. Don't eat it. The best and the safest tooth wash is tepid water.

Never sit or sleep with cold feet. A mixed diet of animal and vegetable food is the best; the vegetable portion should predominate.

Regularity of the time in eating has much to do with the preservation of health. Do not eat late suppers. Water standing for some time in a room becomes impure, by absorbing noxious vapors from the air.

All sleeping rooms should be thoroughly ventilated. The bedding should be often changed and kept well aired.

"Hay Fever" may be instantly relieved by bathing the nostrils and closed eyelids with spirits of camphor and warm water.

Whoever eats "heavy" pie (crust or "soggy" bread, commits a crime against his physical well-being and must pay the penalty.

Thoroughly cleanse the cellar. Ventilate it without, summer and winter. Suffer no decayed vegetables to remain in it.

Colds are often caught by standing in an open hall or doorway during cold weather. The transition of the cold and warm currents causes the trouble.

Wet or damp clothes should be instantly removed. Why? Because they rapidly chill the surface of the body, the heat being carried off by evaporation.

Tax Notice.

I HEREBY notify the tax-payers of Richland County that I shall be at my office from 9 o'clock A. M. to 2 o'clock P. M., from the 1st of July to August 20, 1873, to receive returns from each and all persons liable to tax on real estate and personal property for taxation of 1873; also, all taxable polls are required to make return under the amended Act of the General Assembly, approved 20th February, 1873, to enforce the payment of the poll tax, and in default of the payment of this tax shall be subject to a penalty of double the amount of their poll tax and required to work upon the highway or roads. Any one who shall refuse to conform to the requirements of this Act or obey the directions of the County Commissioners, shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for the same in the County jail for a term not less than ten days.

The Act of the General Assembly provides for the re-assessment of real estate, and to correct the records of the County Auditor's office of errors, if any exist, and to furnish a correct and complete return of all taxable property in Richland County.

The law also requires the County Auditor to assess all parties who fail to make a return of their real and personal property within the time above noted, with a penalty of 50 per cent. on both.

The law in this particular will be rigidly enforced, except in cases of sickness or absence from the County, and all returns will be received and assessments made in accordance with law, at the Auditor's office, in Columbia, S.
