## Tax Notice

I HEREBY notify the tax-payers of Richland County that I shall be at my office from 9 o'clock A. M. to 2 o'clock P. M., from the 1st of July to August 20, 1873, to receive returns from each and all persons liable to tax on real estate and personal property for taxation of 1873; also, all taxable polls are required to make return under the amended Act of the General Assembly, approved 20th February, 1873, to conform to the payment of the poll tax, and in default of the payment of this tax shall be subject to a penalty of double the amount of their poll tax and required to work upon the highway or roads. Any one who shall refuse to conform to the requirements of this Act or obey the directions of the County Commissioners, shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for the same in the County jail for a term not less than ten days.

The Act of the General Assembly provides for the re-assessment of real estate, and to correct the records of the County Auditor's office of errors, if any exist, and to furnish a correct and complete return of all taxable property in Richland County.

The law also requires the County Auditor to assess all parties who fail to make a return of their real and personal property within the time above noted, with a penalty of 50 per cent. on both.

The law in this particular will be rigidly enforced, except in cases of sickness or absence from the County, and all returns will be received and assessments made in accordance with law, at the Auditor's office, in Columbia, S.
