The "unknown" grave near Osceola's last resting place under the walls of Fort Moultrie, contains the bones of the officers and men of the monitor Koekuk, which sunk off the island during the war. The bones were taken from the wreck by divers, placed in a box and buried under the walls of Moultrie. The government has, as yet, placed no monument over the grave which con-tains the remains of nearly 100 of its



M., from the 1st of July to August 20, 1e73, to receive returns from each and all persons liable to tax on real estate and personal property for taxation of 1s73; also, all taxable polls are required to make return under the amended Act of the General Assembly, approved 20th February, 1s73, to enforce the payment of the poll tax, and in default of the payment of this tax shall be subject to a penalty of double the amount of their poll tax and required to work upon the highway or roads. Any one who shall refuse to conform to the requirements of this Act or obey the directions of the County Commissioners, shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for the same in the County jail for a term not less than ten days.


