An extraordinary suggestion is made by the New York Post. It recommends that the President shall urge Congress to appoint a joint special committee to read works on political economy, and consult bankers and merchants, that a sound financial policy may be matured for the President. This implies a confession of judgment to everything that has been said about the President's ignorance on questions of statesmanship. The argument used against hereditary monarchy has always been the possibility of ignorant and incompetent princes succeeding to the throne to be supported at an enormous expense, while the talent necessary to carry on the Government has to be secured from other sources and paid for. But here we pay the President \$50,000 per annum, and his Cabinet officers receive compensation in proportion, and yet it is proposed by one of his party journals that a committee be appointed to do the only serious intellectual work he has been called upon to perform since his elevation to the Presidency. It is to be hoped that after this experience the people of this country will put statesmen in the places which require the exercise of statesmanship, and the Government will no longer have to buy extra brains.

**THE COLORED CONSUL AT STUTTGART.**  
It appears by information received from Stuttgart, Wurtemberg, that the sensation there last month was the arrival of a young mulatto of a gray-brown complexion, a little over twenty years of age, in the person of Egbert O. Sammis, of Florida, as United States Consul at Stuttgart, who on Thursday last was confirmed by the Senate, in place of Emil Klaupprecht.  
The last weekly bulletin, dated the 6th instant, of Secretary Kelly, of the National Grange of the Patrons of Husbandry, shows that the number of subordinate granges organized from the 1st to the 6th instant was 269. The total number of subordinate granges now in operation is 9,049, with a reported aggregate membership of 678,875.

A colored man, named Howard Satterwaite, was killed by another, named Ike Hooper, in Augusta, on Friday night. The murderer escaped into South Carolina, but was afterwards arrested.  
Michael O. Broderick, accused of murdering his son James, in New York, has been found guilty of murder in the third degree.
