He was a carpet-weaver, and by industry had accumulated some money, which he invested partly in real estate and partly in loans. He lost his wife some twenty-five years ago, since which time he has lived entirely alone, the room he occupied being used for work-shop, dining-room and sleeping apartment, and where he alone attended to all his domestic arrangements, refusing assistance from any one.
