At a meeting of the Cemetery Committee of the Memorial Association, held on Saturday, May 2, it was decided that the decorating of the graves should be done by girls from seven to fifteen years of age.

To prevent confusion, the Cemetery Committee has also resolved, that after the general procession from the Porter's Lodge reaches the soldiers' enclosure, only the children who are to decorate and the Cemetery Committee will pass within the enclosure, until after the prayer and the decoration of the graves.

Malmaison, one of the State domains of France, is about to be sold, to assist in the replenishment of the impoverished exchequer. Its origin dates from 1244, when it was a simple farm, dependent upon the parish of Rueil. It was then called Mala Mansio, in remembrance of the deeds committed there by the invading Normans in the ninth century. Toward the revolution of 1789, Malmaison had become one of the most agreeable chateaux in the suburbs of Paris. In 1798, it was bought by Josephine Tascher de la Pagerie, widow of M. de Beauharnais, and the first wife of Bonaparte, who continued to inhabit it after her divorce. In 1826, it was bought by a Swedish banker, who sold it for \$600,000 to Queen Christina. In 1861, the Emperor Napoleon became the possessor of it for 1,100,000 francs. Malmaison is rich in historical recollections. In 1814, it was sacked by the allied armies.

A Richmond (Va.) correspondent says that the solid men of Virginia have taken alarm at the administration of affairs in South Carolina, "and having arrived at the conclusion that the existing generation of blacks will continue to cling to a party in opposition to their former masters, have determined to let them shift for themselves and look for support from those under whose dictation they vote. In short, this must and shall be a white man's State, and to accomplish this object every inducement will be held out for immigration to Virginia, white labor will be given the preference, and the negro may shift for himself until he is willing to recognize the superiority of the Caucasian race, and be guided by reason rather than fanaticism."

Dr. Curry, the noted Northern Methodist preacher and editor, and one of the loyalist men that ever anathematized a rebel, has been down South recently, and has gone back home with some of his "rest theories in a state of utter demolition. For instance, he concludes that the project of mixing whites and blacks in churches at the South is an utter failure. If the negroes predominate the whites stay at home, and if the latter predominate the darkeys stay at home.
