THE CAUSE OF THE UNIONS.—For the first time since the war, the South Carolina tax-payers have in the Tax Unions the nucleus of a vigorous and compact organization, which will swell to the measure of the tax-paying strength of the State, and enable that strength to be effectively exerted for the securing of low taxation and an honest administration of the public funds. Already 181 subordinate Tax Unions have been formed, with nine County Unions. The list is as follows: Abbeville, two subordinate; Aiken, 6; Anderson, 10; Barnwell, 17 subordinate and a County; Beaufort, 5; Chester, 6; Charleston, 9; Colleton, 3; Darlington, 17 subordinate and a County; Fairfield, 15 subordinate and a County; Georgetown, 1; Kershaw, 6; Lexington, 3; Lancaster, 3; Laurens, 8; Marion, 7; Newberry, 10 subordinate and a County; Orangeburg, 13 subordinate and a County; Richland, 10 subordinate and a County; Sumter, 16 subordinate and a County; Union, 11 subordinate and a County; York, 8.

On the 16th instant, a negro went to Mr. Jennings, near Elizabeth City, N. C., and asked for water-melons. Mr. J. gave him some apples, but refused the melons. The negro started to get them, when Mr. Jennings got his gun, whereupon the black rushed upon him. In the scuffle that ensued, the negro was shot in the abdomen and killed. Mr. J. went to town and surrendered himself to the authorities. An examination was made into the merits of the case, and he was honorably discharged. A negro, who was an eye-witness to the difficulty, in court deposed to the truth of the foregoing. The negroes were so enraged at Mr. J.'s acquittal, that it was found necessary to confine him temporarily in jail to prevent violence.
