JUDGE DURELL.—We prefer to let a Republican paper (the New York Times) pronounce sentence upon Judge Darell. It is this:
"Mr. Darell's resignation of the

office of United States District Judge, which he has so long disgraced, is practically a confession of judgment. He is accused of various crimes committed while he held a position which ought to be above reproach and above suspicion. The offences charged against him were various; they ombraced the greater one, of an abuse of his large powers as Federal Judge for political purposes, and a corrupt ad-ministration of his functions, to the pecuniary benefit of certain favored individuals. It is too late for him to remedy the wrong which he did to Louisiana by any tardy confession or contrition. The evil he did will live after him; and his reluctant action, just on the threshold of the session of Congress that would have impeached him, is small reparation for the mischief of his administration. His re-signation will, of course, be accepted, and the universal regret will be that it comes too late to have any other effect than that of a death-bed con-




