

THE NEW POSTAGE LAW.—On the first of January, 1876, the new postage law—requiring pre-payment at the office of publication for all papers sent outside of the County—goes into effect. Residents of Richland County receive their papers free of postage. Subscribers to the DAILY PHOENIX will, therefore, enclose the postage with their subscription, which will be as follows: One year, 50 cents; six months, 25 cents; three months, 15 cents; one month, 10 cents. **THIRTEEN WEEKLY**, one year, 30 cents; six months, 15 cents; three months, 10 cents. **WEEKLY GLEANER**, one year, 20 cents; six months, 10 cents; three months, 5 cents. Where the postage is not sent with the subscription, the time will be shortened to that extent. The new rates of postage are less than half of the old.

CIVIL RIGHTS AND SOCIAL EQUALITY AT THE NATION'S CAPITAL.—One Mrs. Tremiffi, an English woman, and a poetess, seeking admirers for her genius among the dusky hued sons and daughters of this and other climes, has come to grief in Washington City. The papers are full of the affair, and the tender creature has given vent to her over-wrought feelings, not in poetry, but in profanity, we had almost said, but that may not possibly be exactly accurate. At any rate, the fair daughter of song, or mother, (whichever is the correct expression,) certainly did some swearing, for she swore to the outrage before one Thomas J. Shea, Notary Public. Well, all we have to say is that a white woman who holds social converse with negro men upon the door steps, may swear and swear profanely, too, without injury to her character. Commenting upon this occurrence, the Washington Republican says:

"While Congress is deliberating what is best to be done to protect our native-born citizens, we have a case right to the point in this city, occurring in the experience of a native of Great Britain. Mrs. Evangelina Tremiffi, a friend and the daughter of a life-long friend and correspondent of the late Senator Sumner, a lady who has a poem which she has written to deliver to his memory, has been ejected from her boarding house, for inviting a respectable colored gentleman, who ministers to one of the Methodist churches in this city, into the parlor long enough to take his name and number. Other gentlemen she has been compelled to receive on the front-door steps of her boarding house, among them Hon. Mr. Bassett, United States Minister to Hayti. We chronicle the event, and leave it to speak for itself."
