Mrs. Leonovena has been lecturing on Slam in Cleveland. Her knowledge of that country and its rulers must be great, as she occupied the position of governess for the King of Siam's eighty-one children for a term of years. She says she actually prosecuted this work with enthusiasm, although she came near suffering the death penalty on one occasion, for going up stairs and getting in a room above that in which the King was taking his slats—it being a law of Siam that nobody can get above the King in any sense. Mrs. Leonovena says it was very disagreeable for her to be constantly sprawling on the floor when she came into the presence of the autocrat.

In eighty-five years—from 1789 to 1874—the Federal Government has collected in taxes \$6,000,000,000. The extraordinary part of the figures is that considerably more than one-half of the sum, namely \$3,400,000,000, has been collected since the late war closed. The Philadelphia Inquirer (Republican) cannot exactly understand how such things can be, and "not overcome us like a summer's cloud," especially since the national debt is about the same as it was in 1866, and that debt is \$700,000,000 less than the sum collected in taxes.
