THE MAMMOTH CAVE OF MEXICO .-It is said that the mammoth Cacahuamilpa is the largest cave in the world. Several persons who have visited the Mammoth Cave of Kentucky, and that of Cacahuamilpa, in Mexico, pronounce the latter the larger. A volcanic mountain, with an extinct crater, covers this cave. It is not described in guide books or books of travel. It has, in fact, never been adequately described. Mr. Porter C. A moderate current of electricity is then passed through the charcoal from an ordinary electro-magnetic machine. nary electro-magnetic machine, causing it to glow with a very brilliant, but at the same time soft light. 
