Notice to Tax-Payers. THE COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE will be open for RECEIVING RETURNS from JUNE 1 to JULY 20, 1875, instead of from July 1 to August 20, as heretofore.

The law requires the County Auditor to assess all parties who fail to list their personal property within the time above noted, at the same valuation as of 1874, and add a penalty of fifty per cent. thereto; and all new buildings and structures, not returned in 1874, must be returned for the fiscal year 1875, and in default thereof a penalty of fifty per cent. will attach.
