A MACHINE TO WRITE DOWN SPOKEN WORDS.

The London Iron is authority for the announcement that an ingenious Frenchman, named Huppinger, has invented a machine for writing spoken words.

This instrument, it is stated, which is about the size of the hand, is put in connection with the vocal organs, and records their movements upon a moving band of paper, in dots and dashes of the same sort as those employed in telegraphic writing.

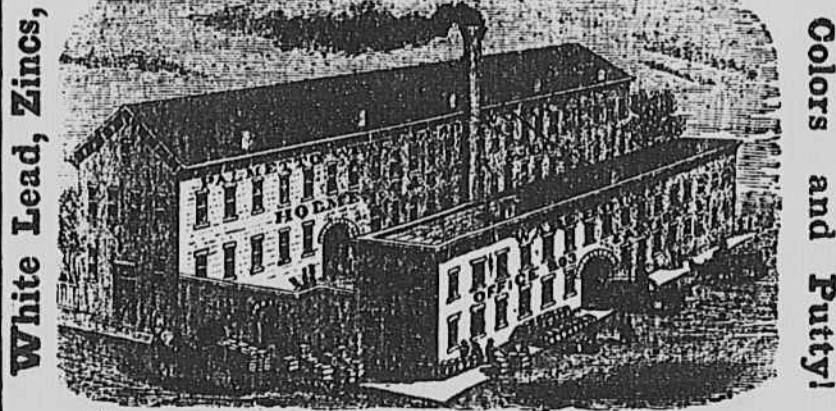
