Later from Europe.

The British Mail steamship Africa has arrived at New York with dates from Liverpool to the 23d ult.

European Intelligence.

The Africa has brought nothing new relative to the war.

The Austrian and Prussian Treaty had been signed.

In England the weather was favorable to the crops, and there had been copious and refreshing rains.

Commercial Intelligence.

The sales of Cotton during the week had comprised 40,000 bales, of which speculators had taken 6,000 and exporters 2,000 bales.

The market opened with a good demand, but fell off at the close, principally on lower grades. On the 21st ult., the demand was fair, and holders firm, with moderate sales to the trade.

The Circular of Messrs. Milligan, Lempre & Co., quotes Fair Orleans at 6 1/2d, Midling Orleans at 5 5/8d, Fair Uplands at 6 1/8d, and Midling Uplands at 5 1/2d.

Messrs. Denistoun's & Co's Circular quotes the Cotton market unchanged; the better qualities scarcer and firm, and the lower grades more plentiful, but not so saleable.

The demand for Flour by the trade was good, and freely met by holders at an advance of 1s. per barrel. Western Canal was worth 32s. 6d., and Ohio 39s. per barrel.

Carolina Rice was worth 20s; Common Rosin 5s 6d; Spirits of Turpentine 50s.

In London, Coffee was unchanged. Sugars showed more animation, with a partial advance. Rice had a downward tendency.
