THIRD DAY—Friday, December 14th.—Water-
ree Stake, for three year olds—2 Mile Heats—\$150. En-
trance, half forfeit, to which the Club will add \$200 if
two or more start.

SAME DAY—Jockey Club Purse, \$200.—Mile
Heats—best three in five.

FOURTH DAY—Saturday, December 15th.—Pur-
year Stake,—post entrance—five for all ages; three
Mile Heats Entrance, \$200—half forfeit—to which
the Club will add \$250, or more if two or more start.
