The attention of Pilots and Masters of Vessels is called to the following provisions of the Quarantine Act which will be rigidly enforced on and after the first of May, proximo: "Vessels from any place where pestilential, contagious or infectious diseases existed at the time of their departure, or shall have touched at such ports.
