An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance, entitled " An Ordinance to regulate Licenses for Taverus Retailing of Spiritnous Li-quors and Billiard Tables" Ratified the 28th day of December, 1846.

Be it Ordained by the Intendant and Wardens of the Town of Camden, South-Carolina, in Council the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to regulate Licenses for Taveros retailing Spirituous Liquors and Billiard Tables," ratified on 28th day of December, eighteen hundred and forty-six, be amended so, that License Number One (No. 1.) under said Ordinance, may be granted to such person or persons as may desire to keep a Public Eating House, and shall actually, and in good faith, keep such Public Eating House; which License shall authorize the holder thereof to retail Spirituous Liquors in any quantity, to be drank on the premises. That Seventy five Dollars shall be paid for License Number One, under this Ordinance, and the Ordi. nance hereby amended, with Five Dollars to the

Recorder. That the Bar or Stand in Taverns and Public Eating Houses, at which any Liquors shall be sold, shall be closed on Sunday; and it shall not be lawful to sell Liquois of any description on any part of the premises of said Taverns or Public Eating Houses That the third clause of said Ordinance, authorizing the Grant of License Number Three, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Ratified in Council assembled, the Thirtieth day of December, in this year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight-as witness the hand of the Intendant, and the seal of the corporation.
