Prices and Prospects of the Next Crops.—The Cincinnati Price Current reports hogs in every region of Kentucky and Indiana as largely increasing in numbers and of better quality, and adds:

We hear but little from Illinois, Iowa and Missouri; but, considering the scarcity of last season it is more than probable there will be an increase rather than a falling off, as we seldom have two seasons of scarcity together.

Throughout Ohio we learn that more young hogs are being fed than usual, and in many sections an increase of one third is anticipated. The high price of pork has caused the farmers throughout the West to bestow as much care and attention upon their pigs as they do upon their children.

Throughout many sections of the South the planters are making strong endeavors to grow their own meat.

We hear of contracts by the packers for the future delivery of some 20,000 hogs, to be fattened in Indiana, at 3 and 3 1/2 cents, gross. Several thousand have been engaged by Madison packers, for the next season, at 4 and 4 1/2 cents, net.

We hear also of various contracts in Kentucky, at 3 and 3 1/2 cents, gross, to be delivered when fattened, in the fall. A sale of 1000 head has been made, delivered here, at 4 1/2 cents.

One of our principal provision dealers and packers sold 100 barrels of mess pork, on Monday, to be made of the next crop, and to be delivered in time, 1842, at \$15 per barrel, which is \$5 per barrel less than the present prices.

The above we believe to be an accurate and impartial statement of the present condition of the hog raising crop, and we leave the reader to draw his own conclusions in regard to the prospect of the next season.

TEXAS NEWS.—We have Galveston papers of the 20th inst.

It is announced that the cotton and corn crops of Western Texas were never more promising than at present. The crop of peaches will also be large.

On the other hand, the Galveston News says that the late rain have extended along the coast counties and considerably into the interior. As was to be expected, they are having a very injurious effect on cotton. The worm had not yet made its appearance, except in a few places, but if the wet weather continues, the worm is almost certain to do great damage. But even now the heavy rain have done some much injury to the open cotton by beating it upon the ground.

A REMARKABLE EAR OF CORN.—We had sent to us recently a full-grown ear of corn, surrounded with eight other ears growing out of the same parent stalk, and forming a cluster of nine ears of corn, all pretty well filled with matured grain. It was grown on the farm of Mr. John Booker, a respectable citizen of this District. This was a very extraordinary vegetable product, and perhaps if corn of this or a similar description were selected for seed, the product of grain might be largely increased.—*Carolina Spectator.*

NEW COTTON.—Two bales of new Cotton were received here to-day, the first of this year's crop, from the plantation of Mr. J. A. Folk, Newberry District, and bought by Messrs. B. C. Catheart & Co., at 10 1/2 cents. Quality, Good Middling.—*Palmetto State Banner.*

CALIFORNIA DIGGERS.—A twenty six pound lump of nearly pure gold was picked up in California by two diggers, who had just taken a hole abandoned by some individuals, who after a week's labor, had not found enough gold to pay for the food consumed. The San Francisco papers say that the lump is to be sent immediately to the United States. It is worth over six thousand dollars, a pretty good day's work for two men. Accounts from the mines appear to be favorable. A revolution seems to have taken place in the mode of mining. Instead of the surface washing, which seems to be almost abandoned in the old diggings, the miners are turning their attention to sinking shafts and drifting scientifically, as at the lead mines in Galena. Immense amounts of labor and capital are employed in conducting water from the upper into remote parts of the mines, where water is scarce, by means of canals, which are constructed on scientific principles, by experienced engineers. New papers are thus being daily opened to the enterprise of the people, which, in many instances, apply to the ordinary of time and money.
