The Auditor's office will be opened for the assessment of all taxable Real Estate and personal property from January 1, 1918 to February 20th, 1918.

All male citizens between the ages of 21 and 60 years are deemed Taxable Polls, except those who are maimed or for other causes are incapable of earning a support.

The law requires 50 per cent, penalty added to taxes on property subject to taxes and not returned for assessment on or before the 20th of February, 1918.
