THE BENDERS IN KANSAS.

Kansas has had many revolting crimes committed within her borders, but none ever equaled the Bender crimes, except possibly the sacking of Lawrence. The Benders lived on the main traveled road, about half way between Thayer and Cherryvale. That was in the early 70's. There were four in the family. Old man Bender and his wife and son and his wife. The son's wife claimed to be a medium and had great it fluence over the members of the family They sold refreshments and fed travelers who happened along about usal time Their house had two rooms, and the partition consisted of a calico curtain. in the early spring of '73 people began suddenly to disappear around that section of the country. They would start out on the Thayer Cherryvale road, and that would be the last seen of them. They would drop completely out of sight.

WHO THE VICTIMS WERE.

In March of that year William York, a brother of Senator York, who played an important role in the Pomeroy senatorial scandal, started from Fort Scott to Independence. He dropped out of sight. Shortly afterward the Bonder family disappeared. The first time they were missed was when a neighbor found a calf tied to a tree dead in the yard. The calf had died of starvation. The people then became curious and began an investigation They found a trap door in the house and it opened to a pit about six feet in diamater. The ground floor wascaked with blood. It smelled of de cayed human flesh. Out in the garder some sunken holes were discovered A neighbor though he would on down and see what he could turn up. He soon struck a corpse.
