Sec. 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

STREET DUTY.

Notice is hereby given that all parties who have not paid street duty must do so on or before April first, 1908, after which the ordinance will be enforced to the letter, and those failing to pay dealt with accordingly. No individual notices will be mailed.

The act relating to same is as follows:

Section 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance all persons between the ages of eighteen and fifty years in the Town of Newberry, S. C., are hereby required to perform six days labor during each year upon the streets of the said town, under the direction of the street overseer, or to pay Three Dollars to the Clerk and Treasurer of the Town Council of the Town of Newberry each year in lieu thereof, which shall be due and payable on or before the first day of April, provided that a receipt in full of commutation tax shall be issued to any person who shall pay the same prior to the month of April: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to exempt any person who shall become a resident of the Town of Newberry, at any time of any year, from performing the labor or paying the commutation tax herein required.

Sec. 2. All persons violating the provision of this ordinance by failing to perform the said labor or to pay said commutation tax in lieu thereof, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than five dollars or

be imprisoned for not more than ten days or sentenced to hard labor on the public works of the said Town; provided, that the provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to persons holding a certificate of physical disability from a reputable licensed physician, said certificate not to be over one year old, and any person presenting such certificate shall make oath before the said Clerk and Treasurer that such disability prevents him from

making a livelihood at his usual avocation; nor to ministers of the gospel in actual charge of a congregation, teachers employed in the public schools, school trustees, and persons permanently disabled in military service of the State, any person who served in the late war between the States, all persons actually employed in the quarantine service of the State, and members of the Fire Department of the Town of Newberry; Provided,
