

BUT ONE DISSENTER

Bristow's Only Voice to Be Raised Against Him.

Washington, Jan. 19.—The nomination of John Skelton Williams, now assistant secretary of the treasury, to be comptroller of the currency, and as such ex-officio member of the federal reserve bank board, was confirmed by the senate in executive session late today.

The only opposition to the confirmation of Mr. Williams was voiced by Senator Bristow of Kansas and William Alden Smith of Michigan. Senator Bristow reviewed the action of Mr. Williams in depositing funds with the Munsey Trust company when it took over the United States Trust company in this city to avert a panic.

Senators Reed, of Missouri, Martin, of Virginia, Mr. Williams' home State, and Chilton of West Virginia praised the ability of the president's nominee for the important post and urged his confirmation.

There was no roll call on the confirmation and the only voice heard against it was that of Senator Bristow. Mr. Williams now becomes a member of the organization committee, now holding hearings in the West to determine on locations of the federal reserve banks, and the new comptroller will prepare to join his colleagues, Secretaries McAdoo and Houston, as soon as possible.

RECOVERS LOST SENSES

Savannah Man Regains his Speech and Hearing.

Savannah, Ga., Jan. 20.—Grover Crawford, the young man who recently lost both his hearing and his power of speech suddenly and mysteriously and who recovered his hearing a few days ago, also recovered his speech. He has returned to his work apparently none the less worse for his trying experience. The case puzzles the doctors very much.

ARRESTS IN LAURENS KILLING.

Two Negroes Said to Have Been Implicated by Tom Young.

Laurens, Jan. 20.—Sheriff Owings and Deputy Sheriff Reid made two arrests today in connection with the killing of George F. Young at his home at Stomp Spring a week ago last night. The two negroes taken today are Greenwood Rodgers and "Junk" Caldwell, both of whom live in the vicinity of the Springs. Their arrest was the result of the alleged voluntary confession of Tom Young, who was implicated by the coroner's jury along with his brother, John, last Tuesday, and both of whom were committed to jail that night. Early today, it is claimed, Tom Young asked to see the officers, it is said he told them the story of the tragedy, implicating Rodgers and Caldwell. In his alleged confession Young said that Rodgers, Caldwell and himself instigated the plot, and executed it late Monday night; that Rodgers shot Mr. Young through an opening in the window, and then Caldwell applied the torch to the cottage.

A week ago this morning the charred body of George F. Young, a well-known citizen of the county and an extensive planter and land owner was found in the ruins of his own cottage at Stomp Springs, twenty miles east of the city, and it was concluded at once that he had been the victim of foul play. The conduct of Tom Young led to his immediate arrest, and later his brother was taken into custody. Since then Sheriff Owings and his deputies have been working quietly on the case, using no coercion whatever in handling the affair.

SOUTH HONORS CHIEFTAIN

Pay High Tribute to Gen. Robert E. Lee.—Birthday of Famous Leader Finds General Observance.

Richmond, Va., Jan. 19.—Celebrations in commemoration of the 107th anniversary of the birth of Gen. Robert E. Lee today were held in Virginia and generally throughout the South. The day was observed as a legal holiday in Virginia, Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina, banks in these States being closed and business partially or wholly suspended. Impressive exercises were held in Richmond, Gov. Mann, Gov-elect Stuart, members of the legislature and local military organizations parading with the confederate veterans and daughters of the confederacy to the Lee monument, where flowers were placed around the base of the statue.

In South Carolina the day found a more or less general observance, principally under the auspices of the United Daughters of the Confederacy. In a number of towns special exercises were held and all the courts and other legal agencies of the State gov-
