HOUSE SUSTAINS COMMITTEE RE-PORT WITHOUT ROLL CALL.

Freear Makes Hard Fight For Investigation, But Loses by Vote of 227 to 98.

K. F. Murray in News and Courier. Washington, Jan. 27 .- At about 4 o'clock this afternoon the house of representatives put the finishing touch to the Grace-Whaley case by rejecting on a yea and nay vote, by a majority of 227 to 98, the substitute offered by Congressman Freear, republican, of Wisconsin, for the resolution submitted by Chairman Post, of elections committee No. 1, in support of the minority report of that committee against any further investigation.

The Freear resolution provided for the appointment of a special committee of seven members to conduct an investigation, sitting where it pleased, and armed with the power of subpoena. Nineteen republicans, including the republican floor leader, Representative Mann, of Illinois, were among the 227 who voted against the Freear resolution, and eight democrats were among the 98 who voted for it. After the defeat of this resolution the majority report of the committee was sustained without roll call.
