The convention shall be composed of delegates elected by the county conventions, each county to be entitled to as many delegates as double the number of its members in the general assembly. When the State convention assembles it shall be called to order by the chairman of the State committee. A temporary president shall be nominated and elected by the convention and after its organization the convention shall proceed immediately to the election of permanen officers and to the transaction of business, When the business has concluded i shall adjourn sine die.

25. The officers of the State convention shall be a president, vice president from each congressional district, two secretaries and a treasurer.

26. Each county delegation to a State convention shall have power to fill the vacancy therein.

27. Any county failing or refusing to organize under the provisions of these rules shall not have representation in the State Democratic con-


