DISTURBANCE HITS SOUTHERN STATES

Thirty-six Victims in Georgia and Alabama—Property Loss Amounts to Millions.

Atlanta, March 28.—At least 36 lives were lost, hundreds of persons were injured and property damaged probably running into millions of dollars, was caused by tornadoes that swept through Georgia and Alabama late today. La Grange, and West Point, Georgia towns near the Alabama-Georgia border suffered the heaviest, the estimated dead at La Grange running to 36, 21 bodies were known to have been found. West

Point, which lost heavily last December from the flooded Chattahoochee, reported ten dead and severe damages in the business section.

The tornado also was felt in Macon where property damage ran high and some persons were injured. Washington, Ga., a town near Augusta, also felt the effects of a storm, but apparently no lives were lost. Some damage also was thought to have been caused in eastern Alabama.

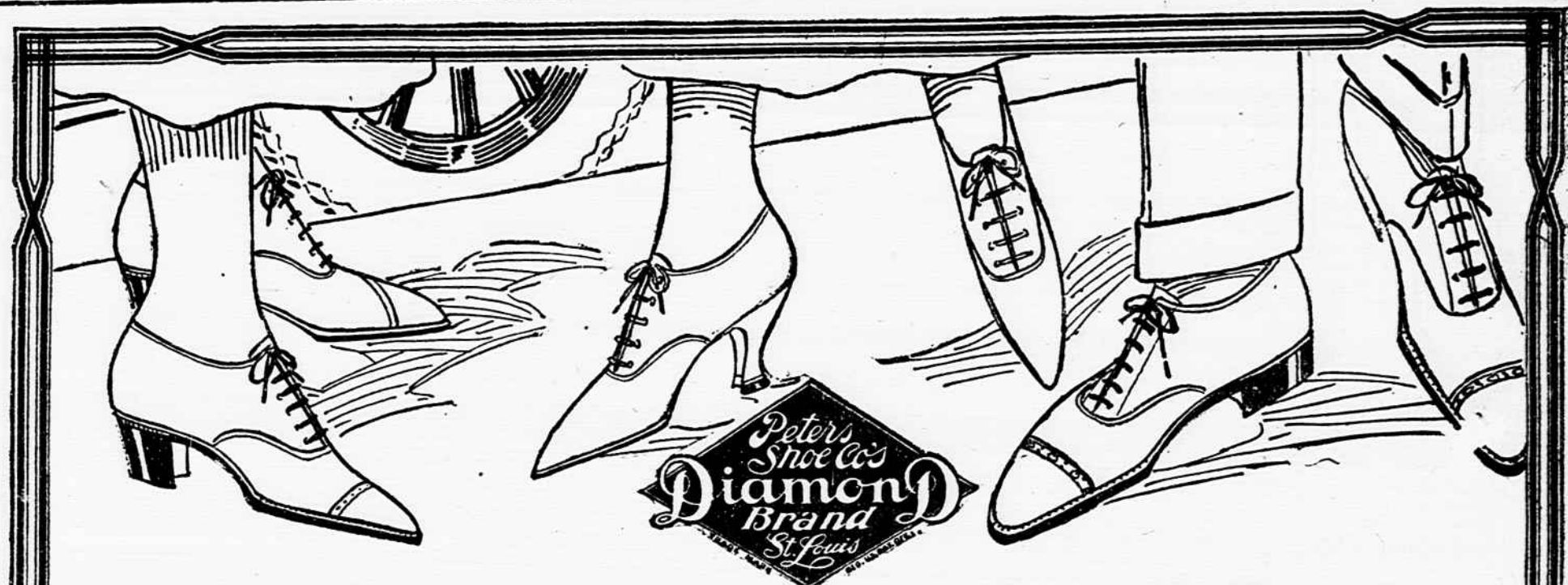
