The School Trustees will please extend this notice.

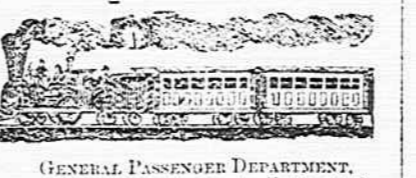

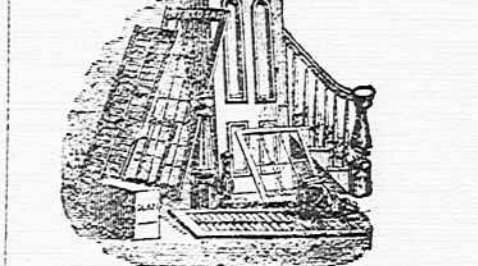
