## CHIEF JUSTICE WAITE.

Morrison R. Waite, Chief Justice of the United States, died suddenly of croupous preumonia, at his residence in Washington, last Friday morning. Mr. Waite had been slight. ly indisposed for several days, but he was not considered dangerously ill, and his wife and all the family except Kingstree, from 1st to 12th of each month. one daughter was absent. A son was telegraphed for, and arrived just before he died. His wife was in California, whither she had just gone on a visit. Mr. Waite was appointed Chief Justice in 1874, by President Grant. 
