

The Republican slate for South Carolina. The Republicans here are so elated at the Presidential victory that they have already made arrangements, not only for appointing out the Federal offices, but have also put out a State ticket for 1890. A conference of the big wigs of the party was held here today, and the following slates made up for Federal offices: United States Marshal, W. H. Hendricks; Collector of Internal Revenue, W. H. Myers; (colored); District Attorney, John Wingate; Assistant District Attorney, S. J. Lee, (colored); Postmaster, W. N. Taft or W. D. Crum, (colored); Associate Justice United States Supreme Court, vice Justice Matthews, to be retired, S. W. Melton; Collector, J. H. Ostendorf; For State ticket in 1890: Governor, T. B. Johnson; Lieutenant Governor, J. F. Fordham (colored); Secretary of State, W. R. Jersey (colored); Attorney General, W. N. Taft; Fiscal Agent and Inspector General, J. M. Freeman (colored); Superintendent of Education, W. D. Crum (colored); Comptroller General, E. M. Brayton; State Treasurer, Gilbert Pillsbury. Ex Postmaster Taft is to be urged for the consulate at Nice, Italy—he being somewhat in bad health. The Democrats in the Federal offices here are getting ready to pack up and travel. There are in the post office, custom house and United States Court departments about twenty Republicans of a mild non-aggressive type, who have held over during the past four years.—Charleston Special to Baltimore Sun.

Death of Mr. John O'Neill.
Mr. John O'Neill, of late years a well-known merchant of this city, died at his residence here on Wednesday night. He had been for years an employee of the South Carolina Railway Company. He was a man who, during a long life, had made a multitude of friends. He was very popular and died regretted both by those who knew him intimately and those with whom he had business relations. He was one of the original founders of the St. Paul's Benevolent Society. Branch 132 of the Catholic Knights of America adjourned last night during an important session when the news of the death of Mr. O'Neill was announced. The information was conveyed by Dr. Dennis Kennedy in the most feeling terms.—News and Courier, Nov. 30.
