The polling place was changed to Pinewood. Telegraphic advices from the Attorney-General ordered that those registered at Fulton were legally entitled to vote at Pinewood. The managers then rescinded their decision debarring the Fulton voters, and peace again . J. M. WELCH.

COLUMBIA, Nov. 4-12 Midnight-Up to this hour only 125 precincts out of 567 in this State have reported officially, giving figures for Governor -- Tillman 13,778, Haskell 5,913. These precincts usually poll about one-third of the vote of the State, so it is unlikely that the total vote will exceed 70,000. Haskell's vote may reach 25,000. The returns as they come in demonstrate the absolute failure of the negroes to support the Haskell ticket, and in various sections they voted for Tillman.

It is not likely that further returns will alter this estimate. The returns for Congressman show six out of eleven districts certainly Democratic by a large majority. The seventh is in possible doubt, with chances favoring Elliott, Democrat, against Miller and Brayton, both Republican candidates. The election throughout the State has been the quietest ever known so far as heard from.
