TOOK HIS OWN LIFE.

THE RASH ACT OF W. C. BAGNAL OF MANNING.

Out of Work and Disappointed in Love, the Young Man Determined to Kill Himself - He Took Laudanum - Two Letters Written Just Before the Deed Was Done.

W. C. Bagnal, a well known and popular young man of Manning, committed suicide at the Calhoun hotel last Sunday morning.

From Thursday morning until Saturday night Bagnal made a number of acquaintances, the most obedient of whom did not fail to notice that the young man acted in a rather peculiar manner.

Saturday night he drank more heavily than usual, and staggered into his room about 11 o'clock.

At daylight the body was removed to McAllister's undertaking establishment at the corner of Meeting street and Hodges alley, where it was embalmed.

Yesterday afternoon Coroner Rivers held an inquest over the remains of Bagnal and a verdict was returned to the effect that the deceased had come to his death from an overdose of laudanum administered during a fit of mental aberration.

Bagnal was about 25 years old and up to the time before he came to Charleston he was employed in the Davis Hardware Company's store at Manning.

The following dispatch was received from Manning last night: Special: Manning is shocked at the suicide of young Willie Bagnal, who took laudanum in Charleston.

The body arrived in Manning yesterday morning and was met at the depot by a large concourse of friends, who escorted the remains to the cemetery, where an impressive service was held.

We might add that warm sympathy was expressed by many in Charleston for the family of the deceased.
