The case against Constable Crawford, charged with the killing of Mrs. Stuart, at the time an attempt was made to execute a search warrant and search for contraband liquor, in the Stuart home in the city of Columbia, was given to the grand jury and a true bill found against Crawford. The other constables arrested at the same time, were released as the prosecution were unable to find a case against them. As soon as a bill was found, Crawford's attorneys moved for a change of venue, upon the ground that a fair and impartial trial could not be obtained in Columbia for the defendant.

The American forces in the Philippines are continuing to win victories over the Filipinos, and all of the cablegrams from General Otis tell the same tale—a complete rout of the enemy, but notwithstanding this the fighting continues and our troops are gradually being drawn into the interior, where the natives can have them away from Devrey's floating engines of death. Aguinaldo seems to be a greater foe than was at first thought and he seems to be somewhat of a tactician judging from the wonderful retreats he has made thus far. The outcome of this civilizing process by extermination is as yet hard to calculate, for although our army officers send back rosy reports, yet we believe the Filipinos will make our experience at imitating England's policy of aggression a sad one. Already the cost has been terrible, when we consider the valuable lives that have been sacrificed, and for what? When the war was declared against Spain there was no thought of going into another hemisphere for treasure; our government went into the conflict upon the ground that humanity demanded that the oppressed

people on the Island of Cuba shall be free, and one of the arguments used to create a sympathy among the American people, was the atrocious crimes that were being perpetrated in the name of law, by the Spanish government, upon a people living at our very doors, and within the same continent of which we are a part.

We set out to free these people and to give them a stable government, and we so posed before the world; the result was that the whole country became fired with enthusiasm, and when the Spaniards wantonly and foolishly destroyed the "Maine" the avenging spirit spread over the entire Union. The North and South went forward to avenge this cowardly outrage and to drive from Cuba the last vestige of Spanish authority; that was what they went there for, and in a very short time in spite of rations furnished by the speculators, Joe Wheeler and Teddy Roosevelt accomplished the mission. There was nothing in the compact to continue the war; nothing was said about sending our ships across the world to take possession of any and every land that is found in a defenseless condition or in possession of some weak nation. The people of the United States do not want the Philippine Islands nor do they want the Philippines as a part of our citizenship, and the sooner the administration withdraws its forces from this field of jungles, savages and pestilence, the sooner will the people be content with what has already been accomplished.

New Zion News.

Editor THE TIMES:

Please allow me a small space in THE TIMES once more to give your readers the news at this place, though we have but little news at this time. The farmers are busy preparing for the present crop, especially corn and tobacco. Cotton is almost out of the question; it can't be raised at the present prices as it money crop, and this year is the year to throw up our hands and show out. I was struck on Mr. Gordon's interesting figures in the last issue of THE TIMES on the cost of raising cotton. I suppose that Mr. Gordon is a close observer and a good farmer. I suppose that he has faced the wall on the cotton question, and I hope that the farmers in this section will soon see the mistake when he plants cotton to make the money out of it. Tobacco is the leading money crop in Salem. Those who have been planting tobacco for the last two or three years have been very successful. A great many new barns are being built in New Zion and Douglas township. A great many tobacco planters will soon look toward the South and Southwest about the 10th of this month for the refreshing showers. I will say just here that those who are experienced in growing the yellow leaf tobacco, give the plant beds your close attention as to keeping them free from the grass and weeds and ground mole, which are destructive to the little plants. To new beginners I will say to be successful you must commence with the intention of making a success. Raising tobacco is like any other business; when you engage in it let your intention be a successful one. A very successful tobacco planter in Salem, when he commenced three or four years ago, prepared his plant bed and went to a friend for seed to plant it. He carried a guano sack to bring the seed home in, but he has learned better, and you will learn just the same. Mr. Editor, let me congratulate the county commissioners for the good roads in Salem.

A log cut storm visited the Paddling Swamp road some time ago, which damaged it considerably.

The question is being asked, who will be the next Governor and who will be the next President? The next President will be Col. W. J. Bryan, and I will guess on the next Governor in my next letter. A. F.

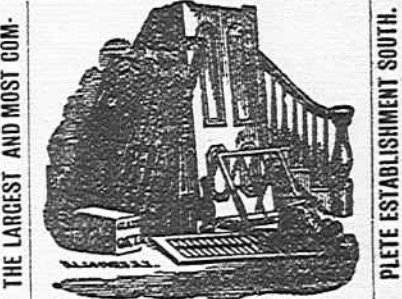
