## THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The General Assemby of South Carolina met yesterday and will probably be in session about forty days. The State constitution adopted in 1895 provides that after the first three sessions from its adoption legthree sessions from its adoption legislators cannot remain in session longer than forty days and receive pay
for their services, so that it is reasonfor their services, so that it is reasonfor their services, so that it is reasonable to suppose we will not have longer than a forty days' session. It might seem that inasmuch as this is campaign year our lawmakers would want to be as economical as possible and have a very short session, but in the general growth, the general progress and development of the State things are widening, and more legislation in detail is necessary. And then the Legislature usually possesses a number of men who are prone to talk on everything that comes up, and others who have a lot of pet and petty schemes which they want to get through, so that many days are time allowed is usually consumed.


